As we wait for the post-pandemic New Creation in Christ to reveal itself to us, (knowing that our Savior has already sown the seeds of Good News in our hearts), watch for news (via flocknote) of the new St. Andrew worship bags! These colorful plastic tote bags (re-usable and easily disinfected) will contain a prayer book, hymnal, and worship binder. We're putting these bags together for your personal/family use in worship at home and (in God's time) at church. Starting next week you can pick up your worship bag in the Narthex, or, at your request, we will deliver it to you.

We will continue to e-mail you the Sunday worship liturgy each week via flocknote. You can either choose to view the liturgy as an e-mail attachment or print it out and insert it in your worship binder. Once we do return to public worship, each person/family should bring his/her personal worship bag to church. You'll bring it, use it, then take it home again and maintain it for your personal use. We will not have worship resources available in the pews. This will help us minimize the danger of cross-contamination through the shared use of books binders for worship.

If you need us to mail you a hard-copy of the weekly liturgy, again, call the church office and we will accommodate. If you are new to St. Andrew and would like to share your contact information with us we will connect you to your neighbors at St. Andrew!

Returning to In-Person Worship

In May, Bishop Hollingsworth released the Diocese of Ohio's plan for our return to In-Person worship as we move forward in living life with the COVID-19 virus. The Phased Return to In-Person Parish Life for the Episcopal Diocese of Ohio gives steps to follow for safe worship together. The plan does not define **when** we return to in-person worship, (that is decided on a parish-by-parish basis).The Plan does define the precautions we must take, and the procedures we must follow once the parish decides to return to in-person worship.

Requirements for in-person worship include:

• Masks are required to be worn by everyone including the celebrant and preacher.

- Both Morning Prayer and Holy Eucharist are permitted liturgies for the principal service.
- It is impossible at this time to provide a safe method of distribution for consecrated elements in the celebration of Holy Eucharist. Therefore, at this time only the celebrant may receive the consecrated elements on behalf of the congregation, while all others say a prayer for spiritual communion.

• Singing carries a very high risk of transmission of the coronavirus, and therefore is not permitted by congregation or choir.

• Live-streaming may continue from inside the church building while maintaining appropriate physical distancing with any participants.

• There may be no physical touching during the passing of the peace and no leaving the pew to acknowledge others. It is permissible to omit the exchange of the peace.

• There is no passing of an offering plate through the pews. Encourage worshippers to offer financial gifts online or to a stationary plate as they enter.

• Households may sit together and at least six feet apart (i.e., 360°) from any others.

• To avoid crowding and bottlenecks, there should be no receiving line following any service.

• At the discretion of clergy and vestry, a brief fellowship time without coffee or food and with proper social distancing may be held, preferably out of doors.
